The conflict-free purchasing policy of Elzacher Feinmechanik GmbH

As a processor of various metals, Elzacher Feinmechanik GmbH is committed to protecting the health, safety and security of people and the environment. The principles are the content of our business practices.

We expect our suppliers to share this commitment as partners in our sustainability efforts.

Conflict minerals

Exploitation of anti-social and environmentally damaging practices in the extraction of raw materials, particularly in the eastern provinces of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), is funding armed conflict in the region. The recently passed "Dodd-Frank" law in the United States of America defines conflict minerals as tin, tungsten, tantalum and gold (3TG) and the products made from them.

Our commitment to sustainable development obligates us to take note of this concern, even though Elzacher Feinmechanik GmbH does not source materials from the DRC.

Elzacher Feinmechanik GmbH is committed to neither purchasing such raw materials or components, nor working with suppliers that we know are using conflict minerals that directly or indirectly finance or promote DRC armed groups.

We have asked our relevant suppliers to confirm that they only supply conflict-free materials to Elzacher Feinmechanik GmbH. The suppliers have confirmed that, as far as they know, they only supply us with conflict-free materials. It should be noted that they may have limited insight into their supply chain to understand the exact origin of the materials.
